A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR SEWER AND WATER SERVICE FOR THE INDUSTRIAL SITES OF THE TIDEWATER SOUTHERN RAILWAY COMPANY.

Whereas, the Tidewater Southern Railway Company intends to construct certain industries upon certain property owned by it westerly of the Tully Road and outside of the corporate limits of the City of Modesto and in that behalf desires to connect with the City Sewer and to obtain its water supply from the Modesto City Water System,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Clerk on behalf of the City of Modesto enter into a contract with said Tidewater Southern Railway Company authorizing said Tidewater Southern Railway Company to connect with the sump in the sewer at the intersection of Arch and Eighth Streets, provided that said grantee shall build and construct its own sewer line at its own cost and expense and under the supervision and direction of the City Engineer of the City of Modesto and that said grantee may construct said sewer in the manner aforesaid upon Arch and Ninth Streets in the City of Modesto. Said contract may further provide that the City of Modesto may furnish to said grantee water from the Municipal Water System and for that purpose shall extend its eight inch water line from the present terminus thereof on Stoddard Avenue to the east line of Tully Road, a distance of approximately six hundred (600) feet, and install a fire hydrant at the new terminus thereof.

Said contract shall provide that said grantee shall pay the sum of Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars for the sewer permit and the sum of Six (\$6.00) Dollars per year thereafter for each building connected therewith upon the premises of the grantee. Said sewer shall be used only for sanitary sewage and not for cannery waste or storm waters. Said contract shall provide that the grantee shall reimburse the City for a part of the expense of constructing said water line to the extent of Nine hundred and twenty (\$920.00) Dollars, and shall install at its own expense its own meter and pay for water furnished at the rate of Twenty-five (\$.25) Cents per one thousand (1000) gallons for the first one hundred thousand (\$100,000) gallons, and at the rate of twenty (20) Cents per one thousand (1000) gallons for the excess over one hundred thousand (100,000) gallons, with a minimum rate of Six (\$6/00) Dollars per month. Said contract shall provide for revocation of the permissions granted upon failure of the grantee to comply with the terms thereof and shall also reserve to the City of Modesto the right to cancel the same at any time upon giving the grantee six months written notice of its intention so to do.

The Tidewater Southern Railway Company, a corporation, having filed with this Council its application in writing for a permit to construct, lay down and operate a spur or industrial track at grade over and across Tully Road, and along and across Stoddard Avenue in the City of Modesto, and of operating trains and running cars over and upon such tracks for the purpose of connecting warehouses, manufactories or other business industries or enterprises with certain lines of railroad which do now enter the City of Modesto; all in accordance with said application and the map or plat of the proposed tracks filed and submitted therewith. Whereas, said application came on regularly to be heard at this regular meeting

held on said 13th day of April, 1927, and a public hearing having been had upon said application and the Council being fully advised in the premises and having jurisdiction to act upon the application;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus, State of California, does hereby find and determine that the public convenience and necessity require the granting of the said application, and the issuance of the permit so prayed for;

And the said City Council does hereby grant unto City Transit Co., a co-partnership, composed of Don Morrill and Lynn W. Morrill, as grantee, a permit as prayed for in said application, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 306 N.S. of the City of Modesto, entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUPERVISION AND REGULATION OF MOTOR BUSES OPERATING ON FIXED SCHEDULES AND OVER ESTABLISHED ROUTES WITHIN THE CITY OF MODESTO, PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS AND LICENSES FOR SUCH OPERATION OF MOTOR BUSES AND PROVIDING FOR THE PUNISHMENT OF VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE;

Starting at the Southern Pacific Reservation or Depot at J and 9th Streets in said City of Modesto, running thence out along J Street in an easterly direction to the intersection of said J Street with Needham Avenue, Downey Avenue, and McHenry Avenue; thence North on McHenry Avenue to the corner of Jones Street; thence easterly along Jones Street to Kimble Street; thence North on Kimble Street to Morris Avenue; thence east on Morris Avenue to the John Muir School, which is the easterly terminus of Route No. 1; thence return westerly along Morris Avenue to Sycamore Avenue; thence southerly along Sycamore Avenue to Needham Avenue; thence westerly along Needham Avenue to Eleventh Street; thence southerly along Eleventh Street to L Street; thence Westerly along L Street to 10th Street; thence Southerly along Tenth Street to J Street; thence westerly along J Street to the beginning point which is the westerly terminus of Route No. 1.

ROUTE NO. 2. Commencing at the Southern Pacific Co. Reservation and Depot at the corner of Ninth and J Streets, in the City of Modesto, running thence Southerly through said reservation to I Street; thence easterly on I Street to Eleventh Street; thence southerly on Eleventh Street to H Street; thence easterly on H Street to the County Hospital which is the easterly terminus of Route 2; thence return westerly on H Street to Sixteenth Street; thence southerly on Sixteenth Street to F Street; thence westerly on F Street to Fifteenth

Street; thence Southerly on 15th Street to D Street; thence westerly on D Street to Fourteenth Street; thence southerly on Fourteenth Street to Grand Street; thence easterly on Grand Street to the City limits at the Dry Creek Bridge; thence return on Grand Street and Fourteenth Street to D Street; thence westerly on D Street to Tenth Street; thence Northerly on Tenth Street to H Street; thence westerly on H Street to Ninth Street; thence northerly on Ninth Street to J Street or the point of commencement and the westerly terminus of Route No. 2.

ROUTE NO. 3. All signs, electrical, or otherwise, must have a clearance of at least 10 feet above the sidewalk, and no such sign shall extend over the sidewalk a greater distance than three-fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of the width of the sidewalk from property line to curb face, excepting that signs over 21 feet above the sidewalk may extend to the curb line.

All signs projecting more than four (4) feet from the structure shall be constructed so they can be swung back to the building.
