A Resolution Providing for a Special Municipal Election in and for the City of Modesto to vote for or Against the Adoption of a Certain Initiative Ordinance.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Modesto as follows:

That under and pursuant to the Charter of the City of Modesto a special municipal election in and for the City of Modesto be, and the same is hereby, called to be held on Tuesday the 28th day of March, 1922, for the purpose of voting upon the question of the adoption of an ordinance submitted in accordance with Section 89 of the Charter of the City of Modesto entitled "An Ordinance Dedicating Lands Belonging to the City of Modesto to Modesto Junior College District of Stanislaus County, California for Educational purposes".

For the purpose of holding said special election the said City of Modesto shall be, and the same is hereby, precincted and established into six election precincts to be known and designated as follows:

- Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 1.
- Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 2.
- Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 3.
- Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 4.
- Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 5.
- Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 6.

Said special election or consolidated election precincts are established by consolidating the general election precincts within the City of Modesto (except as hereinafter noted), as established by the orders or resolutions of the Board of Supervisors of Stanislaus County, California now in force for general election purposes within the City, (which said orders or resolutions now on file and of record in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of Stanislaus County are hereby referred to and by such reference made a part hereof for greater certainty and a more particular description of the boundaries thereof), in the following manner, (said precincts so established by said Board of Supervisors being herein referred to as General Election Precincts);

Said General Election Precincts so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 1, Modesto No. 2 and Modesto No. 3, together with all of the territory annexed to the City of Modesto as described in Ordinance No. 169-N. S. being the north half of the southwest quarter of Section 29, Township 3 South, Range 9 East, M.D.B. & M., are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precincts No. 1";

Said General Election Precincts so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 4, Modesto No. 5 are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 2";

Said General Election Precincts so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 6, Modesto No. 7, Modesto No. 8 and Modesto No. 9, are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 3";

Said General Election Precincts so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 10, Modesto No. 11, Modesto No. 12, Modesto No. 13, Modesto No. 14 and Modesto No. 15, are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 4";

Said General Election Precincts so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 16, Modesto No. 17, Modesto No. 18, and Modesto No. 19, are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 5";

Said General Election Precinct so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 20, Modesto No. 21, are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 6";

The duties of said officers in the conduct of said election shall be the same as the duties prescribed by the Political Code of the State of California for officers of general elections. If the officers appointed hereby do not attend at the opening of the polls on the morning of the election, the electors of the precinct who are present at that time may appoint a Board of Election or supply the place of any absent member thereof.

It is further ordered that such election shall be held in all respects in conformity with the general election laws of the State of California so far as the same may be applicable to and in conformity with the Charter of the City of Modesto. On the day the election is held, the polls shall be opened at 6 o'clock A. M. and must be kept open until 7 o'clock in the afternoon of said day when the polls shall be closed.

The City Clerk is hereby ordered to publish an election proclamation as required by law, in which shall be set forth that there shall be submitted at said election to the suffrage of the qualified electors of the City of Modesto, for adoption or rejection, an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Dedicating Lands Belonging to the City of Modesto to Modesto Junior College District, of Stanislaus County, California for Educational Purposes", proposed by a petition properly signed by a sufficient number of qualified electors of the City of Modesto to be submitted to the electorate of said City at said special municipal election, a true copy of which said proposed ordinance so entitled, together with the petition asking the same to be submitted, is now on file in the office of the City Clerk and is hereby referred to for greater certainty. The initiative ordinance above referred to shall be printed and it shall be the duty of the Clerk to enclose a printed copy thereof in an envelope, together with a sample ballot, and mail the same to each voter at least three days prior to the election. And it is further ordered that a copy of said proposed initiative ordinance shall be published in full at least once at least three days prior to the holding of said election.

INDORSING H. R. BILL 10212 (67th CONGRESS, 2nd SESSION) ENTITLED " A BILL TO SUPPLEMENT AND AMEND AN ACT ENTITLED 'AN ACT TO CODIFY, REVISE, AND AMEND THE LAWS RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY' (ACT OF MARCH 3, 1911, CHAPTER 231), AND KNOWN AS THE JUDICIAL CODES, AND TO LIMIT THE JURISDICTION OF DISTRICT AND CIRCUIT COURTS IN CERTAIN CASES".

WHEREAS, it appears that the public Utility Commission of the State of New Jersey, by unanimous decision, recently decided a case involving the determination of street railway rates of the largest utility company in that state and affecting a territory comprising two-thirds of the population of New Jersey, after the case had been pending for two years and nearly 14,000 pages of testimony had been taken,

AND WHEREAS, it appears that the utility company ignored the courts of the state and made an ex parte application to a United States District Judge for an injunction, upon which summary proceeding the court authorized a rate in excess of that allowed by the commission,

AND WHEREAS, by reason of the Courts action, the principle of state regulation of public utilities and state sovereignty in this regard is in serious danger, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the bill introduced by Congressman Bacharach of New Jersey (H.R. 10212) be and the same is hereby indorsed and urged for speedy passage and approval.
