

# Overview of the City's Finances

Recovery from this depressed economy is still a way off; however, there are glimmers of hope that we have reached the bottom and are now in the process of resetting to a new norm. Recent projections indicate that sales tax is trending up ever so slightly and property tax is still trending down slightly. Over the past three years, the City Council and City Management have worked diligently to focus on prudent spending that aligns with revenues so that the City can continue providing core services to Modesto residents.

Across all City funds, the Fiscal Year (FY) 2010-11 adopted budget included staff reductions of approximately 63 employees from the prior year and expense reductions of more than \$10.7 million. In the last two years combined, the budget has been slashed by \$25 million and the City's workforce has been reduced by approximately 213.

The General Fund supports a wide variety of City services including some of the most visible to citizens –fire, police, park maintenance, recreation programs, graffiti abatement, economic development as well as general government. So where does General Fund money come from? Sales and property tax are two of the largest rev-





enue sources for the General Fund – they have also experienced the most dramatic decline in recent years which is why the General Fund has endured the majority of staff and expense reductions. The chart to the left illustrates the decline in three of the City's largest revenue sources:

There are still many financial challenges that lie ahead. While the gap between expenses and revenues is tackled each year, there are still significant structural changes that need to be addressed. Two of the largest financial liabilities to the City are pensions and retiree health benefits. The City has begun the process of meeting with all of its employee labor associations to address these issues and identify and agree upon permanent solutions.



## Building the Budget... you can get involved!

The Modesto City Council is again reviewing its revenues, expenses, services and programs to determine the most prudent path going forward on behalf of the community for the coming fiscal year. As the effect of staffing and service reductions has accumulated over the last several years, cuts have had to go deeper into important services. Tough choices will be made, and you have a chance to be part of the discussion by participating in the May Budget Workshops with the Finance Committee of the Modesto City Council.

The Finance Committee takes the lead role in reviewing the Mayor's Proposed Budget which is a collaborative effort between City Management, the City Manager and the Mayor. The Finance Committee budget review takes place at budget workshops held in May. The budget workshops are open to the public and are meant to increase the public's understanding, participation and input into the City budget process. It is more important than ever for your voice to be heard regarding which services you value most.

The budget workshops are scheduled\* as follows:

- Monday, May 9
- Thursday, May 12
- Monday, May 16 (if needed)
