Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program

Project Description:

This program will provide traffic calming improvements to residential neighborhoods. Citizen participation will be strongly encouraged in identifying neighborhood needs. Following public outreach efforts, projects will be prioritized and developed by City Staff to improve traffic flow and safety in residential neighborhoods. Anticipated improvements include traffic calming measures (chicanes, curb extensions, medians, pedestrian refuges, pedestrian crossing, speed cushions), signage and striping, ADA improvements, signal upgrades (detection cameras, ADA push buttons, beacons) where needed.

Outreach will begin in 2020, ranking criteria related to project benefits will be developed, anticipate project submissions from the public due in November 2020. Projects will be evaluated, and each year a project will be selected for Measure L funding, and proposed with the next fiscal year's projects.
