Community Workshops on Modesto 2050- Land Use Alternatives

Modesto, CA, September 26, 2024 - The City of Modesto has initiated the first comprehensive update of its General Plan since 1995, called "Modesto 2050: Our City. Our Future." The updated General Plan will serve as the City's blueprint for future decisions regarding land use, growth and development, community services, mobility, housing, and resource conservation, among other topics.

We are excited to announce an upcoming round of [community workshops](#). During this phase of engagement, we are asking the community to share their ideas about the future boundary of the city and what type of land use or development they want to see.
